4 FIND AND ADVOCATE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL SUPPORT

5 BUILD YOUR OWN EDUCATOR NETWORK



Build relationships and collaborate with other educators who are supportive of undocumented students at your school or district

6 CONNECT STUDENTS TO IMMIGRANT LEADERS & ROLE MODELS



Attend immigration related events and build a network of immigrant student leaders

7 INVOLVE PARENTS



Share information and resources with parents by distributing Know Your Rights card, emergency plans and collegeaccess information. Visit: ilrc.org

8 ACCESS REPUTABLE LEGAL INFORMATION & ASSISTANCE

9 BUILD AGENCY & POWER



Inform students about their rights and share how other immigrant groups have organizing and changing the status quo

10 CREATE SPACES FOR STORYTELLING & CREATIVE EXPRESSSION



Encourage students to build their own meaning and sense of identity that is different from the negative stigma and stereotypes about undocumented immigrants

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
